Dress Code

Woodard Junior High School encourages students to take pride in their attire as it relates to the school setting. Students should dress in a manner that, in addition to the following rules, takes into consideration the educational environment, safety, health, and welfare of themselves and others.

- All undergarments must be covered. Revealing/Sheer clothing is prohibited.
- Tops must be long enough to cover the torso and must have sleeves that cover the shoulders.
- Bottoms must be long enough to cover at least mid-thigh. Holes cannot occur above the mid-thigh.
- Bottoms must sit at the waist. Sagging bottoms are considered dress code violation.
- Jewelry that presents a safety hazard to self or others is prohibited.
- Students must wear shoes at all times.
- Headwear must be worn forward and may not be worn inside school buildings unless worn in accordance with religious practices and/or medical needs.
- Profane, obscene, or defamatory language or symbols, ethnic slurs or symbols, drugs, sex, or alcohol is prohibited.
- Clothing which infers or is associated with gang affiliation is prohibited.
- Apparel that the administration determines as disruptive to the educational process is prohibited.

In addition to the above guidelines, students who are involved in extra-curricular activities, such as athletics, band, choir, etc., are subject to the standards of dress as defined by the sponsors of such activities.

Violations:

1st Occurrence - The Woodard Staff will remind students of expectations and will confiscate the item if applicable. Staff may also have the student report to the Health Office to call a guardian for a change of clothing if the situation calls for such action. Students will be asked to change into school issued clothing if guardians are unable to be reached.

2nd Occurrence - The Woodard Staff will remind students again of expectations and will confiscate the item if possible. Staff may also have the student report to the Health Office to call a guardian for a change of clothing if the situation calls for such action. Students will be asked to change into school issued clothing if guardians are unable to be reached.

3rd Occurrence - The Woodard Staff will remind students again of expectations and will confiscate the item if possible. Staff may also have the student report to the Health Office to call a guardian for a change of clothing if the situation calls for such action. Students will be asked to change into school issued clothing if guardians are unable to be reached. School Administration will be contacted on any further dress code violations.
